Since its establishment in 2012 by the Lebanese Welfare Association for Handicapped (LWAH), Phoenicia University (PU) has rapidly evolved into one of Lebanon's most dynamic higher education institutions. As a non-profit, private, and nonsectarian university, PU is committed to providing quality education that is accessible to all, fostering innovation, leadership, and societal impact.

The University's 110,000 square meter campus in Zahrani, just 40 minutes from Beirut International Airport, serves as a hub for learning, research, and community engagement. PU comprises six colleges: Architecture and Design, Arts and Sciences, Business, Engineering, Law and Political Science, and Public Health. It offers thirteen undergraduate programs and the MBA program, marking a deliberate step toward becoming a research-driven institution.

PU is a student-centered university adhering to the American educational system. It prepares graduates who are job-ready, globally aware, and ethically responsible. Through innovation in learning and teaching, PU empowers students to become future leaders, innovators, and contributors to society both locally and globally.

The University's Artificial Intelligence program exemplifies this approach.
